


- Our next 5th Sunday Lunch is scheduled for April 30th when we will be celebrating the twelve months of the year and birthdays. It will be a covered dish lunch.


#### **UMW of Faith - Singleton Sisterhood Unit**

#### Blessed by the blesser to be a blessing.

Read: Genesis 12:1-3, Isaiah 42:1, 6-7

The blessings God gives us are intended to be shared with all, beginning with the inestimable blessing of salvation from sin and including all the other good things the Lord has given to us. I know that I have been greatly blessed. Perhaps you have too. So many of us have been given so much: material goods, adequate incomes, families, friends, jobs, homes. And that's just for starters. If you're a Christian, then whatever your circumstances, you've been given the greatest gifts: faith, hope and love. And you have been blessed with



the means of grace and the hope of glory. If you have Christ, you have been given everything that is eternally worthwhile. So, the big question is "Why?" Why have I, why have you, been so blessed? The answer to that question is found in Genesis 12:2-3. In the opening verse of Genesis 12 the Lord tells Abraham, "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you. I will make you into a great nation and I will bless you." Abraham

went, and God blessed. But this isn't the whole story. For that you need to read the rest of the sentence. Here's how it continues: "I will bless you," God says to Abraham, "and you will be a blessing. . . . and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you" (Genesis 12:2-3). God's promise to bless Abraham is accompanied by a further explanation. His blessing of Abraham is just the first step in a much bigger plan to extend that blessing through Abraham to all the earth's peoples.
